

Dear Friends of Ebenezer Reformed Church,

Hi! My name is Gloria Bellows. I'm the pipe organ at the church. I'm sure you all have heard me. I've provided musical accompaniment for your Sunday services, weddings and funerals. I've been part of your church since 1949. I was young and healthy back then, but now I'm 70 years old and definitely feeling my age. I have some problems. The leathers, little pieces of leather that act like bellows to control the air into my pipes, are so old that they are drying out. Eventually they will leak air, and then no sound will come out. That would be so embarrassing! Recently, the organ tuners were here to tune me so I'll play the correct notes, but I'm so old my pipes still play out of tune and don't sound like they did in my younger days. The organists are doing their best to make me sound good, but it's getting more difficult. I understand my repairs would be too expensive and it would be best for our church to replace me with a new young and healthy organ that will play beautiful music to glorify our God. The worship and music committee has decided to purchase an electronic digital organ which will stay in tune even with the temperature fluctuations in the sanctuary and has minimal, if any, maintenance expense. It is comparable in sound to pipe organs, but higher in technology. It will play music even though the organist is on vacation! Unfortunately, because of my old age and repairs needed, I'm not worth much to sell. Any donation towards the cost of the new organ would be appreciated.

Note: The new organ will be purchased from the Allen Organ of Iowa for a price of \$134,035. We already have \$14,000 in the organ fund, plus another \$60,000 in pledges. That leaves a total of \$60,000 that needs to be raised between now and installation. A 20% down payment will be made upon signage of the contract. Another 40% will be due 12 weeks later. And the final 40% will be due upon completion of the installation. Make your pledge or donation today in the office or by designated envelope.



Missionary Spotlight

Ben & Kelita Johnson

Going back to August—Kelita reported the family had an amazing time in July at Summit Week, hosted every 5 years by Cornerstone Int., in Wilmore, KY. It was a wonderful experience to meet other mission families and the CI Staff—and also to be strengthened in their faith and commitment to the mission field.

Their 4 children started attending a bilingual school in the city of LaCeiba, just 30 minutes from the orphanage—and shared they got off to a terrific start. It marked the first time since their arrival in July of 2023 that all 4 of their children have been able to attend the same school—a real blessing for sure! Kelita asks for continued prayers as they transition to this school and to pray they will continue to do well in their studies and make new Christian friends.

Just recently, a mission team arrived on Jan. 18 to spend a week with them—and left Jan 24. The main task of the recent team was to help run a camp for the kids—Kelita reports it was a huge success!

FUTURE PLANS - Looking ahead they continue to prioritize Bible lessons with the children in Urraco on Sat. mornings. They continue to strategize how to best meet the needs of local parents who are helping in the ministry. Ben continues to work with the young people of the ministry by helping lead the weekly discipleship class and by using his skills and pastoral heart to walk alongside parents in the ministry and also missionaries on site. They have future dreams

too—and are praying about certification for short-term care for babies, and hope to help Hondurans realize their talents more by starting small businesses or ministries. They also plan to have frequent times of prayer, worship and Bible study in their home and with friends.

PLEASE PRAY - That the Lord will clearly lead and help us stay focused while abiding in Him in a world full of great needs and hurts. Please keep GiveHope2Kids staff, volunteers and all the precious children in your prayers. Please pray for protection (physically & spiritually) for our family. And, overall, pray for the nation of Honduras!

Each team will arrange and schedule the visits. Liturgy to be used was shared.

Elder Prayer Room Assignments: Assignments were distributed for post service congregational prayer.

Approve Minutes from December Meeting: There was not a meeting in December so nothing to approve.

Next meeting and Closing prayer assignments: Next Elders meeting will be February 9,2026. Assignments were given for closing prayer. Jon Kophamer is assigned to prayer.

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:30pm. Absent were Jon Kophamer, Jenny Patton and Darlene Schipper.

Devotions & Prayer: Pastor JT opened the meeting with devotions from 1 Timothy 3:1-13, followed by discussion and prayer.

Pastor's Report: Pastor JT shared Consistory Guidelines and roles for Elders and Deacons. A new updated Consistory contact list was given for review and will be added to the bulletin for members to have. Prayer was given by Pastor JT.

Where have we seen God at work at ERC? -Pastor Craig Sipes -worship music and filling in pulpit -Christmas Concert -Christmas Eve Candlelight service -Movie Sermon series leading up to Christmas yielded a good attendance -Good year of giving

Deacons Report: Dave Weber stated they have discussed various projects. Assistance funds being one of them and are looking for suggestions as to where to use the funds.

Elders Report: (see Elders minutes)

Finance: Gregg Wiersema reviewed Financial report/budget of year end December 2025. **M/S to Approve Financial Report/budget MC. M/S to use the Bush House proceeds to help pay for new boilers. MC. M/S to have Gregg Wiersema's name added to the ERC account at Community State Bank and to remove Marcia Blean's name from account. MC.** Nancy and Dave Weber will need to renew their information to stay on the account with Community State Bank.

Building/Property: Brian Tichler has been getting several bids to have the parking lot redone and is ongoing. We are also getting bids on Security cameras for both main entrances of the church as well for the parsonage. He also stated that Ladies Aid would like new chairs for the fellowship hall, they have money they would like to use for this purchase. **M/S to purchase new chairs paid for by Ladies Aid Approx 130 chairs. MC.**

Church Life: Phil Ardapple reported they are still working on various activities such as Taco Trivia, Father/Son and Mother/Daughter banquets.

Worship/Music: Keith Hamstra reported the December services leading up the Christmas was very well attended. The Christmas concert went very well with the suggestion of having the piano moved closer to the stage so performers could be seen vs just looking at their backs. The Christmas movie sermon series was tied together nicely with the viewing of the movie the day before the church service. It was suggested to try to make the fellowship hall a little cozier for viewing the movies in the future (kids bringing blankets and pillows and maybe a couple of sofas). There was discussion about upcoming sermon series for the year by Pastor JT. Thank you to Pastor Craig Sipes for filling in when Pastor JT was not available. Arlene Dickey and Deb Vanzuiden came to the meeting for a brief update on the new organ we are looking at getting. The GX342a organ will cost \$134,035.00 in which we already have \$64,000 and a pledge from an anonymous donation of \$10,000 making our organ fund \$74,000. The rest of the money we will need to get through donations or fund raisers.

Youth/Education: Sandi Wilkens reported Aftershock started up January 7, 2026 as well as Heavens Express started January 11th. Camp Manitoqua representative will be coming soon to discuss this year's dates and cost for attending. It was suggested that the "deposit" be increased to \$50.00 per child so that there will be a lesser likeliness of dropout from going to camp. The Mid-High kids would like to have a praise and worship time once a month, thinking first Sunday of the month for about an hour in the afternoon. We need someone to help with this so she asked Pastor Craig and Kathi if they would be willing to do this, waiting to hear back.

Assistance/Memorial: Dave Weber reported we have money in the account and need suggestions as to where it could be used/needed. There is \$740.00 left from the Bob Vandermyde memorial fund, **M/S to use the \$740.00 toward the new organ. MC.**

Sacraments: no report at this time. Next communion will be February 22.

O.M.E. Task Force: no report at this time as first meeting will be January 13, 2026.

Approve minutes: No meeting held in December so no minutes to approve.

Old Business: By-laws approval. **M/S to approve updated By-laws. MC** Was noted to look at and update every year.

New Business: New organ proposal **M/S to purchase the GX342a organ. MC**

Next Meeting: Monday February 9, 2026

Adjournment: **M/S to Adjourn post prayer. MC**

Closing Prayer: Barney Habben closed in Prayer.
