



Missionary Spotlight Roger & Sue Scheenstra



This month our newsletter features a couple who have served faithfully with the RCA for many years in a remote area of Africa and we have had the privilege of supporting them with a full share. This update was received just a week ago from Sue— Important: please remember to make no mention of the country they are serving when texting or emailing as there is concern for reprisal from hostile Native anti-Christians. In this email, Sue states: We are so thankful that rains have been falling, which brought an instant springtime to the region. The area received over 3 inches of rains and meant that the people did not have to make the 7-hour journey to bring water out to the cows. PRAYER REQUEST: Please pray for continued rains and for river recharging all through the rainy season—(Nov. & Dec.)

Sue also reports there was a large Mu\$lim convention the 1st of November and visits were made home to home, seeking to strengthen I\$lam in the community and to find more who could be enticed to go on *tabliki* with them. (These are Mu\$lim mission trips that last for 1-4 months and are highly subsidized.) PRAISE THE LORD: We are thankful for one encouraging story from Timothy, as he found 2 friends from a nearby village who had joined the visiting *tabliki* group. Timothy pulled them aside privately and shared the Gospel via the story in the Bible of the two kingdoms of light and darkness. These two men believed and joined the Christian group he meets with for encouragement in the evenings during the time for visitors.

<u>PRAYER REQUEST:</u> Pray that Timothy and the believers will stand firm in their faith in Jesus as extra pressures are put on them. Pray that new believers would be protected from enemy attacks and stand firm in God's full armor, growing always in their faith, in their understanding, in their boldness and in love and in grace. Many believers are still fragile in faith and are riddled with fear of persecution—some still are deeply ingrained with deception. <u>PLEASE PRAY</u> for God's Holy Spirit to be poured out with power to give hunger and thirst for the truth, to deliver them from roots of sin and to nourish and bless them with the abundant life of Jesus!!

<u>IMPORTANT AIRPORT UPDATE:</u> This important location-wide meeting is scheduled for the 19th of Nov. (*now past*). Sue reports that people are standing firm against this airport expansion, which would put all of their AIC housing & buildings in the landing zone. Until a final decision is made AGAINST the airport, there is a chance for bribes and corruption to sway people to change their minds. (*As of this writing, word has not reached us on the outcome of this important meeting. We pray that the meeting DID take place and with a favorable outcome—God's Will be done!*)

<u>A BRIEF "TEAM" MEMBERS UPDATE:</u> The Scheenstra's recently had a great Saturday with Jake & Sadie & Kids, who have sensed spiritual warfare on them and wanted to get together for prayer. <u>PRAY</u> for them & other members of the team. Also, <u>PRAY</u> for "B" & "R" (they are in a cousin tribe to the "O" tribe) as they intern with Roger & Sue's Team for 4 months & spend time in each of the team's villages!

Sue would close by asking us to remember the following word, **GRAPES**, and the slogan it represents as they continue to minister to this nomadic group of Natives on the continent of Africa.

May <u>G</u>od <u>R</u>eap <u>A</u>buntantly as we <u>P</u>ray <u>E</u>arnestly for <u>S</u>alvation for the "O" people. You may email her at <u>sue.scheenstra@aimint.org</u>

Ask the Pastor:

Why is Christmas Day on December 25?

The Bible does not specify the exact date of Jesus Christ's birth. Early Christians did not celebrate Jesus's birth, and there is no biblical mandate for commemorating

it on December 25th. The earliest recorded celebration of Christmas on December 25th dates to the mid -4th century AD, in Rome. Before this, Christians focused on celebrating Easter, the resurrection of Jesus, rather than his birth. December 25th coincided with several popular pagan festivals in the Roman Empire, particularly the festival of Sol Invictus ("the Unconquered Sun") and Saturnalia, a weeklong festival honoring the god Saturn. These festivals were characterized by feasting, gift-giving, and merrymaking. Some historians suggest that early Christian leaders selected December 25th to provide a Christian alternative to these celebrations and to facilitate the spread of Christianity by aligning it with existing traditions. Another rationale is symbolic: December 25th falls shortly after the winter solstice, the darkest time of the year in the Northern Hemisphere, after which the days begin to lengthen. Early Christian writers, such as Augustine, connected the birth of Jesus—the "Light of the World"—with the return of the sun's light, making December 25th a fitting date for the celebration. In summary, Christmas is celebrated on December 25th not because of a biblical directive or historical certainty about Jesus's birth date, but as a result of historical developments, theological symbolism, and the adaptation of existing cultural festivities. The date reflects both the spread of Christianity in the Roman world and the desire to infuse Christian meaning into established traditions.

Consistory Minutes - November 10, 2025

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:30. Barney Habben and Martha Kophamer were absent.

Devotions and Prayer: Pastor JT read Acts 20: 28-31 followed by discussion and prayer.

God at Work: more new members including children, Remembrance of Dearly Departed Members, recognition of veterans, music by Craig and Kathi, increased offering, pastor's message series.

Pastor's Report: Pastor JT will be attending the Exponential Conference in Naperville November 18 - 20. The conference focuses on discipleship and evangelism. He will be in Ohio for Thanksgiving- Thursday, Friday, returning Saturday. Pastor JT shared his plans for his sermon series to begin on Sunday, November 30 titled "Christmas at the Movies." The series includes movie viewings to take place prior to each service.

A draft of the plans for the annual meeting on November 16 was shared.

Elder's Report: Jan: (See Elders Minutes)

Deacon's Report: No report. Property/Insurance: Work on the parking lot will not take place until at least spring. The drinking fountain is working so we will not be purchasing a new one. The boiler installation is finished. Bob will look into inconsistent temperatures on the three levels of the education wing. Presentation:

Consistory broke from the agenda to hear a presentation by Steve Steely from Allen Organ Company. Mr. Steely had previously provided quotes for a new organ that will be looked at by the Worship and Music Committee. The committee will provide a recommendation to consistory in the future.

Church Life: No report. (\$3,861.07) funds were reported.



Endowment: Current balance is \$909,184. Finance: Our current assets are \$456,322.06. It was noted that the proceeds from parsonage 3 of \$78,088.26 have been added. The Aftershock Meals fund has a balance of \$5322.62 thanks to generous donations. The general fund is doing well at \$157,252.95. Assistance/Memorial: The balances of the assistance(\$3,161.99) and memorial (\$3,861.07) funds were reported.

O.M.E. Task Force: Pat talked about the Chili Cookoff / Game Night that took place on October 19. It was well attended. The next event will be Trivia Night in January. We have added Ryan Karp to the list of missionaries ERC supports. The committee will meet on Thursday, November 13.

Sacraments: Communion will be served on Sunday, November 30. This is the first Sunday of the advent season.

Worship/Music: The implementation of the blended music is going well. The recognition of departed members during the service on November 2 and our veterans on November 9 was well received. There will be another hayride to church on November 23. Craig and Kathi Sipes will provide the music for the Thanksgiving Prayer Service on Wednesday, November 26. Sunday, November Pastor JT begins his Advent sermon series. Details were shared in the Pastor's report. The Christmas Concert will be December 7 at 4:00.

Youth/Education: Mary Schaefer will begin working with the bell choir during Heaven's Express on November 30. They will take part in the Christmas Service on December 21. Youth and Education will hand out Traditional ERC Treat Bags after the Aftershock program on December 10 and the Christmas Service on December 21.

Approve Minutes: M/S to approve October, 2025 minutes. MC

Old Business: We continue to look at the possibility of starting Dinner Church with Emmanuel. Ken expressed interest in going to Crossview in Fulton with representatives of Emmanuel to see what they are doing.

New Business: The budget for 2026 was viewed and discussed. M/S to increase annual contribution to Resthave from \$1,000 to \$2,000. MC M/S to approve the 2026 budget as shown. MC

The December 8 meeting will be a dinner at 6:00 with new consistory members and ERC Staff in attendance.

Consistory members were given a copy of the Ebenezer Reformed Church By-Laws to read through. The Executive Team has been reviewing these extensively in the past year.

The 2026 Consistory will meet Sunday, December 14 after the service for the purpose of seating the Executive Team and assigning committees. Adjournment: M/S to adjourn after prayer. MC Closing Prayer: Pastor JT closed in prayer.

Annual Congregational Meeting - November 16, 2025

The annual meeting was **called to order** by Pastor JT Bean at 10:50am. (62 voting members and 11 non-voting members were in attendance with a total of 73.) He then opened the meeting with prayer.

Expectations for Church Membership: This handout was distributed and reviewed.

Endowment Fund Report: Ken Jansma announced we had no contributions made this year so far but we did well with our interest income. Our balance as of October 31 is \$910,956.54. There were no questions concerning the Endowment Fund. Sue Bond shared this is about a 16% return on the previous balance.

Nominations of Elders and Deacons: Pastor JT thanked the outgoing members: Ken Jansma, Martha Kophamer and Jan Renkes as Elders and Marcia Blean and Pat Pessman as Deacons. New nominated Elders are Jon Kophamer (2-year term), Melinda Hamstra and Sandi Wilkins. And Deacons are Randy Renkes and Gregg Wiersema. **M/S to elect these persons to the Consistory. M/C.**

Budget: Pastor JT distributed graphs pertaining to the giving. We are currently above our goal. The proposed budget for 2026 had been distributed at the beginning of the meeting. Nancy went through each section explaining anything that had noticeable changes. A few areas of change are: we will be giving all staff a 3% cost of living raise. A few other line items need to increase because of cost increases in these areas. It was also proposed to increase our giving's to several of our missionaries, add Ryan Karp as a mission project and increase our giving to Resthave from \$1,000 to \$2,000. Total increase to the budget is \$37,021.85. There was no discussion concerning the budget. **M/S to approve the 2026 proposed budget. MC.** Pastor JT also shared a couple of tables on tithing for our information.

Pastor's Report: We have 27 new members, 4 baptisms and 7 deaths. Our total membership is 211. He and Sue have initiated a "New Member Welcome" process which will start when the person attends the Elder's meeting requesting to become a member. He shared a lengthy list of "Where we have seen God at work at ERC". He highlighted the following: We moved from the RCA to the ARC. We have become more aware and feel a closer connection to our missionaries that we support. Church camp was well attended and we provided scholarships for some. The re-instating the ringing of the bells has been enjoyed and we hope the neighbors do too. The monthly diner club is enjoyed by many. We hosted the combined service with Emmanuel this year, hosted VBS in August, added monthly prayer meetings and had some hayrack rides for kids on Sunday to bring them to church. We have been very blessed.

From addressing the results from the Brain Storming meeting we had in May, we have hired Craig Sipes to add some contemporary music to our services. There has been a small increase in youth activities, and some discussion about adding a youth minister position. Future goals are adding a fire pit for social and Bible class gatherings, an arcade room and hire a part time youth person.

A couple of future goals are a "Morrison Community Dinner" in conjunction with Emmanuel Church, hiring a youth minister and possibly doing a mission trip.

Pastor JT shared his projected preaching calendar topics that take him through Easter and beyond.

Building Projects and Fund raising: The new boiler has been installed. Proceeds from the sale of Eloise Bush house will be used to cover the expense. We need some major fixes to the parking lot. We have a bid for 1 phase of \$76,000. Some tuck-pointing needs done with a verbal estimate of \$5,000-6,000. There have been several meetings concerning the organ and different options. Deb and Arlene (organists) have been involved. It has been decided to have the Music and Worship committee make the final decision and bring it to Consistory. There has been an anonymous donor to plant the seed money. Ken Jansma stated we may have a fundraiser for the rest. There were no questions concerning the organ.
