To my surprise and delight, it was a diverse group of preachers. Most of them were African-American pastors and the worship band was a black gospel group from an inner-city church in Chicago. So, as you can imagine, it was a much different kind of environment than what we are all used to here in Whiteside County at our Dutch Reformed, Ebenezer Church!

Because of the diversity of background and skin tones, there was a great variety of preaching styles that I was exposed to. Each pastor had profound insights to share on how and why we are to preach. The keynote topics included:

- Crafting Compelling Preaching
- The Sacrifices of Pastoral Ministry
- Illustrating the Word
- Preaching the Love of Christ
- Biblical Application
- How Compelling Preaching Changes Lives
- Reaching the Nations by the Power of the Spirit

Each session and workshop was a worthwhile lesson for me as your pastor. Since the conference, I have been going over my notes often to continue gaining greater insights.

The weekly preaching responsibility is every minister's most important task. Some weeks it is a challenge and a chore to prepare a decent sermon. But honestly, my friends, most weeks it is a privilege and a pleasure! I enjoy the work of sermon preparation as much as I do the delivery. And I do my best each week to feed you solid food (meat, not milk) from the pulpit. A pastor's biggest mistake is not providing solid biblical content to his congregation. When I am finished with my current series on the Apostle's Creed, I will be starting a new summer series which will be a verse-by-verse study of the book of Galatians. Something to look forward to!



Missionary Spotlight Angel Lopez

Angel Lopez, who is supported by our church and serves with the Reformed Church of America, is our missionary focus this month. Angel serves the needs of migrating people who are hoping to find a better life for themselves in the United States. As they cross the border from J Juarez, Mexico into El Paso, Texas, Angel is there to meet and greet and

help prepare them as they continue their approved journey into the U.S. The border crossing where Angel serves is called "Frontera de Gracia" or the Border of Grace. While at the border, people will find just that through Angel's efforts! They will also find temporary refuge and a place of worship, which in turn, gives Angel many opportunities to be the "hands and feet of Jesus"—and to share the Gospel of Good News with these immigrants.

Angel grew up in Chiapas, Mexico. As a child he saw firsthand how RCA missionaries could make a difference as they shared the gospel and cared for those in need. Today Angel is doing the same thing as he serves the needs of those who need help and hope. His responsibilities include educating people about the border situation and providing resources for immigrants. He also works with local churches to develop congregants who can build relationships with these individuals as they look to build a brighter future for themselves in the United States.

Please pray for Angel Lopez as he serves the Lord at the Frontera de Gracia, located just minutes from El Paso. Pray that the border can be a safe place where people will come to know Jesus as their Savior and that the Holy Spirit will move in the hearts of these travelers as they move to new locations in the United States.



May Consistory Meeting

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:26pm. The entire consistory was present!

Devotions and Prayer: Pastor J.T. opened the meeting with devotions from Psalm 33:6-9 and prayer.

Where have we seen God at work at ERC? Healthy attendance and givings. Mother-Daughter ticket sales are going well. 21 kids are signed up to attend summer camp at Manitoqua. We received a new/used big screen TV for the upstairs conference room. (William will work on getting it hooked up and make sure it works for us.) The fellowship time is active-good attendance. The Woman's Bible Study also has had good attendance.

Elders Report: Martha: (See Elders minutes.)

Deacon's report: Nancy discussed how all of the "funds" on the budget are actually only 1 checking account.

Finance: Nancy asked for approval to add Marcia Blean to the checking account and remove Ron Williams from the same. It was approved. M/S to give Courtney Brucker a credit card for church expenses. Deb Adolph's credit card is being cancelled. She distributed "Committee Spending Guideline" form. All committees should use this as guidelines and be cognizant of what they are spending and IF there is money allotted for it. It will be reviewed annually at the beginning of the year after the committee chair persons are determined and the new budget is approved. The April numbers were reviewed and discussed. M/S to approve April budget.

Property: Marcia gave updates on Bob Wiersema's projects and building repairs/upkeep. Marcia would like to get the kitchen floors stripped and rewaxed. It has been many years since it has been done. She found someone that will do it for \$350. Ken Jansma said roof discussion continues. Perhaps we should form a "Roof replacement" committee. Martha suggested that if this happens, some non-consistory members should be on it.

Church Life: Ken Jansma – The Mother-Daughter banquet is May 14th. There will be prizes! They are working on the citywide garage sale.

Endowment: Ken- No report this month.

Worship/Music: Scott Meurs- Carol Kent who filled in for pulpit supply April 7th was well received Graduation Sunday is June 2nd. June 16 is Father's Day. We will have a Women's choir. Bob Hoffman will fill the pulpit. The requested drum set, microphone and amp was approved to be paid for by the Endowment Fund. Jenny Patton is working on a Youth band.

Youth/Education: Jan Renkes- Heaven's Express final day will be May 12. Twenty-one campers are registered. The church cost is \$6,247 and the bus will be around \$1,800. Books will be handed out to the graduates on June 2 when they are recognized. VBS is looking for a few helpers to assist with crafts. Let Jennie Pruis know if you can help out. On 3 Wednesdays in June, there will be activities for kids. July there will be a Family Fun night and August will be an ice cream social and After Shock registration.

Assistance/Memorial: Dave Weber- The bathrooms remodeling projects came to \$9,414.78. The lower level men's bathroom flooring was \$1,478.54. It still needs to be painted. Remaining balance in Memorial is \$1,251.85. Assistance balance is \$2,186.99.

Sacraments/Communion: Barney Habben- Communion will be served June 2. Home visits will be done that week also.

O.M.E. Task force: Pat Pesssman- They discussed the Elder Care District get togethers in July. The focus of the meetings will be prayer, giving, random acts of kindness, and discussion about our status with the RCA. Gary Gray will have a presentation in the fellowship hall on May 26 about his recent mission trip to Guatemala. We reviewed the current missionaries we support and discovered we needed more information on Angel Lopez. He is currently positioned on the border between the U.S. and Mexico. Pat will submit more information to the congregation. On August 21, Brad Hurtig will have an inspirational program at the Morrison High School auditorium. This will be sponsored by the Morrison Ministerial Council. It is geared for middle and senior high students.



Consistory Meeting Minutes Continued

Approve Minutes: M/S to approve April, 2024 minutes.

Old Business: None.

New Business: -Insurance: Ken had some numbers he gathered from Guideone Insurance. This is a different company than we are currently using. The total figure is \$20,361.00 which is less than we are paying, but still a lot. There was discussion about eliminating insurance on some buildings/garages. It has been learned that we cannot just have personal property insurance. We must ensure the building if we want to insure the contents. Further discussion with the committee is needed.

-Alliance of Reformed Churches: Pastor Luke Schouten and elder Loren Tenboer from Emmanuel Church shared about their experience with leaving the RCA and their alignment and experience with joining the ARC. The ARC has been in existence since March 2021. They follow the Reformed Church theology and use the same liturgy for communion and baptism etc. Nothing in the church services has changed. Most change is seen in the structure/hierarchy. Instead of "dues" as we currently pay to the RCA, the churches make a donation to the ARC of 3% of their budget. It is not mandated and no one checks the finances. It is on the honor system. Of the 3%, 1% goes to the denominational staff. 2% goes to the networks (which is similar to the "Classis") Emmanuel belongs to the Upper Mississippi Valley Network. Within the Network is then "Clusters". Emmanuel is in a Cluster with a couple of churches in Fulton, Eldridge and Davenport. There are currently 200 churches in the ARC most of which are churches who have left the RCA. The biggest difference is that the ARC takes a stand against homosexuality and gay marriage. This has been adopted into their By-Laws. The RCA has some churches that do and some that do not allow it. [They allow them to worship and attend. They just will not perform a gay wedding.] ERC needs to continue to discuss this. Pastor J.T. is attending the RCA General Synod in June and we hope to have deeper discussions after he returns.

Next meeting: June 10, 2024. Jen is assigned to prayer.

Adjournment: M/S to adjourn post prayer. MC.

Closing Prayer: Ken Jansma closed in prayer.
