### **Dear Friends of Ebenezer,**

I want to update you on a number of key concerns for our church that will be a matter of prayer for all of us a members and attenders here. The first thing is our church finances. I know nobody likes to hear the pastor beg for money. That's not what I want to do either. But the Consistory has had a growing concern for the decline in our general fund over the last 3 years. This concern must be addressed. Please pray for a growing generosity in our giving.

Secondly, there is our affiliation with the Reformed Church in America. We will need to continue to assess what is best for us in the future. Should we stay in the RCA? Or should we graciously exit the denomination and join a new one? This, too, will need to be addressed. One way that will help us to do so, is that I have been invited (and agreed) to be a delegate at the General Synod conference in June. The meetings will be held June 13-18 in Tucson, AZ. I will be going as a elder delegate for the Illinois Classis. Attending General Synod will allow me to gain a first-hand understanding of any further discussions and to have a vote on any legislation that is put forward. Please pray for wisdom and discernment.

One of the things that the elders are planning to do this summer (on Tuesday nights from July 2nd to August 6th) is hold a series of six "Care Group" gatherings with prayer as our main agenda. The two areas of prayer mentioned above will be a key focus, as well as other areas of need that come up between now and then. You will be provided more information about these gatherings in the months and weeks to come, but I am sharing this with you now because it is our desire that every Ebenezer member and regular attender make it a priority to attend their assigned Care Group gathering. And if the date of your elder's care group gathering is a conflict with your summer calendar, you can attend a different night. So stay tuned for more information about that.

For the time being, let's ride the wave our wonderful Good Friday and Easter celebrations as long as we can! There are many exciting events and worship experiences ahead of us. And there are many ways for you to get involved and serve. Enjoy the warmer weather this month, and may God bless you as you seek to grow in Christlikeness each day!

# What is Rastafarianism?

This question came up after someone watched the movie "One Love" which is a biographical film about the life and music of the famous reggae artist Bob Marley. Rastafarianism is both a religion and a social



movement that has its roots in Afro-Caribbean culture, particularly the island nation of Jamaica. So it is both a faith and a political movement focusing on things like: justice, ending oppression, and human rights. Rastas re-

fer to God as "Jah", a shortened form of the biblical Yahweh or Jehovah. With this. Rastafarians view black people as the reincarnation of the biblical Israelites, making them God's chosen people who had been enslaved and exiled to Babylon (Jamaica). For Rastas, Babylon represents a white colonial system and stands for evil. They believe Rastafarians will one day be freed from Babylon through the return to the promised land of Zion, which many believe is Ethiopia, or Africa in general. Followers of Rastafari believe the use of marijuana, known as ganja, is spiritual and that the "holy herb" stimulates a meditative state, bringing them closer to Jah. There is no one in a position of leadership in the Rastafari movement but there is a man named Haile Selassie (former Emperor of Ethiopia) whom they believe to be the Messiah. Selassie died in 1975.

#### **March Consistory Meeting**

The monthly consistory meeting was held on March 11, 2024. Pastor J.T. Bean, Keith Hamstra, Martha Kophamer, Pat Pessman and Teresa Stout were absent.

Ken Jansma opened the meeting with a discussion of Sunday's sermon, **Suffered Under Pontius Pilate.** He also led prayer following the roof replacement presentation.

A presentation on roof replacement was given by Jesús and Carlos from Avila's Home Improvement and Construction. The presentation included many pictures of the roof from the inside and outside. There were also pictures of interior damage caused by leaks. The presenters explained the process for making an insurance claim to cover the replacement. No action was taken.

The question, "Where have you seen God at work in our church?", was asked. Replies: 85 reservations for the Father/Son Banquet and a great program; youth involvement in Sunday services increasing; the possibility of a youth band; Christian Reformed members expressing how comfortable they are feeling at ERC.

The Deacons report was given by Marcia Blean. They continue to tweak the procedure for collecting the offering.

The March 2024 Elders Meeting Minutes were read by Jan Renkes.

The Financial Report was given by Nancy Weber. The balance in the general fund was up from the previous month. Total assets as of February 29, 2024 are \$393,310.09.

There was no report from Church Life.

The Worship/Music Report was given by Scott Meurs. We continue to work on ways to include contemporary music. The choir will sing on Palm Sunday. Plans continue to be made for the Good Friday Service. Carol Kent will present the message on April 7. Jovie Patton has joined the sound system team. There is the possibility of a youth band being put together.

The Youth/Education Report was given by Jan Renkes. The After Shock Swimming Party will take place on March 20. The ERC office has been organizing sign ups for summer camp.

The Assistance/Memorial Report was given by Dave Weber. The balance of the assistance fund is currently \$2387.

The Endowment Report was given by Ken Jansma. The balance of the endowment fund was \$712,738.29 as of the end of January 2024. M/S to add Sandi Wilkens to the Endowment Committee to serve a 3 year term. M/C She is replacing Bob Wiersema whose term expired.

The Sacraments Report was given by Barney Habben.

Communion was served to 114 people during the service on February 18. Another 11 people took communion at Resthave. The elders and Pastor J.T. served communion to shut ins the following week.

There was no O.M.E. Report given.
