

Ask the Pastor: What is the difference

between childish and childlike faith?

Good question. There is a big difference. Keep in mind, Jesus said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children,

Missionary Spotlight The Pitcher Family

Background Info: Andrew grew up in Morrison and Sophia in Chicago. They met at the Illinois Math and Science Academy in Aurora. After marriage, they

moved to Minnesota in 1998 and joined Wycliffe Bible Translators in 2010 and served in different capacities over the years in France, Senegal, and South Africa. They have been married for 26 years and have three daughters. Jasmine is 23 and recently married and lives near Baltimore and works as a software developer. Isabel is 20 and a junior at Northwestern University, majoring in engineering. Violet is 15 and a sophomore in high school. From 2016 to 2021 they were based in South Africa, but Covid forced them to do their work via Zoom. So, they decided to return to the US until Violet finishes high school. They are currently serving Bible translation teams in Southern Africa on Zoom via remote assignment.

Update: They will travel to Cape Town, South Africa on March 14th and will help facilitate a workshop and training event for Deaf Christians from all over Southern Africa who are translating the Bible into their native sign languages. This event will go through April 1st.

Prayer Point: Please pray for the safe travel and for wise counsel to be given and received.

Ministry Update: They are in need of more prayer and financial partners and an increase in giving toward their ministry . They are currently receiving 78% of their Wycliffe-determined budget. They have not been able to give significant time to partnership development since launching their ministry in 2010.

Prayer Point: Please pray that the Lord would help connect them to church and individuals who want to join them in His work and get them to 100% in order for them to devote all of their time to ministry.



February Consistory Meeting

The monthly consistory meeting was held on February 12, 2024. Martha Kophamer and Pat Pessman were absent.

Dave Weber read scripture from Philippians 2:1-5 and Pastor J.T. Bean followed the discussion with prayer.

The February memory verse, Hebrews 11:6, was recited by Consistory members.

The question, "Where have you seen God at work in our church?", was asked. Replies: Worshippers from Christian Reformed attending and getting involved; sermon on creation; Taco and Trivia Night well attended- good food; the work of the Church Life Committee; family in parsonage #2 attending church events.

The February 2024 Elders Meeting Minutes were read by Jan Renkes.

The Deacons Report was given by Marcia Blean: They are changing the procedure for collecting the offering They intend to put together a schedule for collecting and counting. They voted to make a \$500 donation from the assistance fund to Jeg Weets.

The Financial Report was given by Nancy Weber: Total assets as of January 31, 2024 are \$381,396.96. A deposit of \$2200 for first month/deposit on parsonage #2 was noted. An increase in the monthly expenditure for music staff was explained. M/S to approve the Financial Report. M/C

The Church Life Report was given by Pastor J.T. The Taco and Trivia Night was attended by 60 people. A 2024 schedule for fellowship volunteers has been put together and is almost full. There were 11 different soups and 65 attendees at the Souper Bowl. The ticket cost for the March 5 Father/Son Banquet is less than the meal cost so the price of tickets may need to be raised next year.

The Worship/Music Report was given by Scott Meurs: Jenny Patton is getting kids to participate in the February 18 service. The choir will sing on Palm Sunday. There will be a Good Friday Service at ERC. Carol Kent, Rooted In Christ speaker, will give the message on April 7 as Pastor J.T. will be on vacation. The organ will be tuned soon.

The Youth and Education Report was given by Jan Renkes: Arrangements are being made for the After Shock Pool Party on March 20. The committee decided not to host an Easter Egg Hunt, because there are too many others. Preparations are being made to send kids to Camp Manitoqua the week of July 8. M/S to approve using the Dixon Bus Company to transport the campers at a cost of \$1,800. M/C

The Assistance/Memorial Report was given by Dave Weber: The balance in the Memorial Fund is the same as last month. It was mentioned that the Eloise Bush Memorial Gift may be used for the top floor classrooms. A gift of \$500 from the Assistance Fund will be given to Jeg Weets.
