Dear Church Family,

At the start of a new year I thought I'd give some Christian insights on New Year's resolutions. What if we shifted the focus from self-improvement to spiritual growth and the glory of God? While the Bible does not explicitly command New Year's resolutions, it encourages regular self-examination, setting godly goals, and relying on the Holy Spirit rather than human willpower for lasting change.

1. Prioritize Spiritual Fitness Over Physical Goals: While physical health is important as the body is a "temple of the Holy Spirit" (1 Corinthians 6:19-20), Christians are encouraged to prioritize spiritual disciplines like daily Bible reading and prayer. Physical fitness, the most common new year's resolution, should be secondary to spiritual fitness.

2. Examine Your Motivation: A common Christian critique of resolutions is that they can become self-centered or rooted in vanity. If your resolutions are only focused on you, then go back to the drawing board. Ensure that your goals include loving others.

3. Rely on God's Strength, Not Just Willpower: Many resolutions fail because they depend solely on human effort. Christians are encouraged to "commit their way to the Lord" (Psalm 37:5) and seek His strength for any change. We must understand that being able to do all things through Christ who strengthens us means that we must depend on His strength continuously in order to do all things—including the keeping of all our resolutions.

4. Focus on Daily Grace and Habits: Rather than waiting for a yearly "reset," Christian life is viewed as a daily process of renewal (2 Corinthians 4:16). If you make every day a destination for your spiritual life, then resolutions aren't as necessary (and you won't feel as guilty for not following through—tomorrow is a new day!).

5. Incorporate Community and Accountability: Seeking wisdom from others and finding an accountability partner are biblical strategies for successfully maintaining goals. Without counsel, plans fail, but with many advisers, they succeed. (Prov. 15:22)

A Prayer for the New Year:

Heavenly Father, thank You for the gift of a new year. Guide our steps, strengthen our faith, and help us to be a light in our community. May we grow closer to You and each other in 2026. In Jesus' name, Amen.





Ask the Pastor: What is “Reformed” Theology?

This is actually the title of one of my Sunday sermons this month. Theology is the study of God and religious beliefs. “Reformed” theology is a way of understanding and living out the Christian faith that is deeply rooted in the teachings of the Bible and the historical traditions of the Protestant Reformation.

Reformed Theology traces its roots to the Protestant Reformation of the 16th century, particularly to leaders like Martin Luther, John Calvin, and Ulrich Zwingli. These reformers (and others) sought to return the church to the teachings of Scripture and to emphasize key biblical truths about God, salvation, and the Christian life.

Ultimately, Reformed Theology is not just a set of ideas—it’s a way of life. It calls us to trust in God’s promises, rely on His grace, and seek to honor Him in every area of life. It encourages us to study the Bible deeply, worship God sincerely, and serve others generously, all for the glory of God.

If you’re curious about Reformed Theology, I will be speaking in my next sermon series about the history and teachings that came out of the Protestant Reformation. I think you will learn a lot and be strengthened in your Christian faith. After all, the goal of Reformed Theology is to help us know God more fully and to walk with Him faithfully, every day.

Missionary Spotlight

Ryan Karp



This month we are introducing a new missionary that we are supporting. Ryan Karp is the Vice President of **Chosen People Ministries**. Formerly from Chicago, Ryan is now based in South Florida with his wife and 3 kids. You may recall Ryan was with us hosting the Seder Meal on Maundy Thursday last year.

Since then, we have kept in touch with Ryan and believe it is important to support him and his ministry to Jewish people around the world. **Chosen People Ministries** is dedicated to praying for, evangelizing, discipling, and serving the Jews who do not yet know Jesus as Messiah (the Savior). We will be supporting Ryan starting out at \$100/month for now.

Ryan was scheduled to speak at our missions conference last September but had to cancel due to some health issues. It has since been determined that he has cancer and he is currently going through chemotherapy treatments. Please pray for a healing miracle, and for him and his family to be comforted and strengthened. Here is a recent personal note from Ryan Karp himself:

The Lord is good! He delivered the Hebrews from bondage. He was ever-present during the trials that Joseph endured. He was faithful to King David even when David didn't deserve it. Jesus healed people with faith and with people who were merely curious. Over and over again, in the Bible and I am sure in your personal life, you can point to times He has been faithful.

Many people have been asking for updates on my stage 4 pancreatic cancer and treatment. Jessica and I have been overwhelmed by the love that you have poured out on us in those requests and in your support in prayers. Unfortunately, there are just too many requests for updates for us to update each person individually.

There are not too many updates at this point. I am in the hospital for four and a half days getting tests and three straight days of very strong chemotherapy. Then I get to be home for nine and a half days. The chemo and ensuing couple days are challenging and tiring.

But amidst these challenges the Lord is good. He has answered prayers about pain in my legs which is now gone and removing pain when I breathe. He has also removed some things which could have caused more stress in this journey/battle. He has given me more energy (though not a normal amount) so I can spend more time with my wife and kids. Lastly, I have been able to have spiritual conversations with doctors and nurses and our church pastor has invited me to collaborate with him as he prepares for weekly sermons to 500 people.

As for specific prayer requests, please pray for divine healing, increased energy (even though the doctors say my fatigue will grow with chemo), and reduction in blood clots. Please pray boldly for Jessica as she is carrying so much for our family right now; that the Lord would bless and embrace her, and that the Lord would protect our three kids' hearts and minds.


